



West Virginia Personal Options

Worker Additional Training Hours Resources (TBIW & ADW)

In addition to the initial and annual training requirements of the Personal Options program, workers providing services for an TBIW participant must complete an additional 2 hours per year of training and workers providing services for an ADW participant must complete an additional 4 hours of training per year focusing on enhancing direct care services delivery knowledge and skills.
