Community grows stronger through hundreds of **little** and **big actions** citizens in Maine take **every day**.

This list provides ideas of places and opportunities to explore.

As you support people to explore community and do their own community mapping, you're sure to find lots of other opportunities.

This list should encourage you to think not just about going to a place but finding opportunities for people to learn new skills, share a hobby, join organizations or groups that interest them, try new things, and build valued roles.

Actions that Build Community in Maine: Animals



Take action and lend a hand (or an eye, or an ear) for wildlife. Participate in community science or community-based research efforts to help collect data in support of wildlife conservation through Maine Audubon Society.




